

Free Fruit in School

Free fruit is now available to ALL children in school! The government provides children Sucking in Key Stage One with free fruit but as a school we feel that all children should be entitled to it,



so have secured a charitable donation to help us provide this.

Each class in Key Stage Two now has a box which will be placed out on the playground containing their class' fruit for the day. The type of fruit (or vegetable) will vary and includes things such as apples, tomatoes, bananas and carrots.

Please can you encourage your child to eat at least one piece of school fruit a day and take advantage of this fantastic initiative! As a school we are looking to try and stop all unhealthy snacks at breaktimes and will therefore be offering children pieces of fruit as an alternative to any unhealthy snacks which we spot.

We would appreciate it if you could support us by ensuring that your child does not come to school with unhealthy snacks as chocolate biscuits, packets of crisps and sweets.



Water Bottles

Please can we remind parents to be mindful of the type of water bottle that their children are bringing to school. We have recently seen some glass water bottles being brought in and due to health and safety reasons these really aren't suitable for school. Please ensure that your child does not bring a glass water bottle to school!

We encourage all children to drink plenty throughout the school day. Our policy is that only water is to be consumed during lesson times and PE. At lunchtime cordial and water (squash) is permitted. Thank you in advance for your support with this matter.

Attendance

Attendance has seen a significant rise over the past year and a bit, with the school consistently being above the national average of 96%. Thank you for all of your support.

Unfortunately our school attendance has started to drop again and although we know that there was a significant amount of illness during November and December, we also know that there are a number of children who are not attending as well as they could be. When children do not attend school as much as we would expect, we have had to send letters home which may eventually lead to a fine should school attendance not improve. If you do get a letter then please do all that you can in order to ensure that your child is at school as often as possible.

Where there are concerns about school attendance, Mrs Pask holds meetings with parents and carers to ensure that the school can support them and address any

concerns they may have. Hopefully we will be able to work together to ensure that our children are in school as often as possible and get back to above 96%. Thank you to all those parent/carers (there are lots and lots of you) who continue to ensure that your children attend school regularly.
