## Forest Schools Grant

I am delighted to be able to inform you that the school has been successful in its bid for lottery funding to help us develop a forest school in our grounds. The school has received around £9,000 to invest in the project, which will enable us to apply for forest school status once it has been completed. As part of the project we will train a member of staff to become a forest schools leader. We will also develop the woodland area (at the end of the field by the outdoor classroom) and turn this into a 'forest' providing us with the resources needed to lead forest schools activities. The staff have already received training this week to use some of our latest outdoor equipment, including a den-making kit! As a school, we are very much looking forward to taking some of our learning outdoors!



## Lateness

This term we will be having a push to ensure that all children are arriving at school in time to begin the school day with the rest of their class. When a child arrives late at school, they miss valuable learning time. This is something that we must ensure does not happen. The table below shows the way in which lateness can add up over time to make a huge difference to the amount of time that children are spending at school. We teach essential skills during the first session each morning and any lateness can make a massive difference to pupils' progress. We welcome children into school at 8:50am each day. Children are considered to be late if they arrive after 9:00am. If they arrive after 9:20am they are marked as unauthorised absence for the morning!

Number of minutes late a day	Number of days missed a year!
5	1 and a half days
10	2 and three quarter days
15	4 and a quarter days
20	5 and three quarter days (over a school week)
25	7 days
30	8 and a half days

This is based on children spending 5 hours and 20 minutes in class each day.

## Bikes and Scooters

Please can we remind all parents and carers that children should not be riding bikes or scooters within the school grounds- this could lead to other children (including those who are not yet at school) getting hurt! Upon entering the school grounds, children should walk bikes and scooters to the appropriate shelter/ storage area and leave them there. At the end of the day, children should collect their bike or scooter from the shelter and then walk them back out of the school grounds before riding them. Thank you for your support with this matter.

## Driving near school

We have had a number of reports about dangerous driving near to our school gates. Cars have been mounting the curb when pedestrians are nearby and there have been a number of 'near misses', which could have led to people getting hurt. Please can we remind parents and carers to be considerate when driving near to school as we would not want there to be any serious incidents. Thank you for your support with this matter.
