As a school we continue to ensure that we are doing everything we can to prevent the spread of Covid-19.



Magic Breakfast

Starting from Tuesday 3rd November, the school will be providing every child with the option of a light snack (a bagel) as they come into school. This will mean that our older children will be given the option of half a bagel and our younger ones a quarter. We are able to do this due to funding that we have received through an initiative called 'Magic Breakfast.' We have reviewed the allergy information that we currently have in school and will ensure that these children are catered for. **Please can you ensure that your child's medical information is up-to-date with the school office!** Your child does not have to eat the bagel that is offered, this is off course optional. We hope that by providing all children with a light snack that they will have even more energy to put into their learning!

Car Parking

Please could all Parents, Carers and visitors be considerate when parking outside of the main school gate. We have had reports of cars being parked too far onto the pavement, restricting the space for people to pass with pushchairs. As they are unable to get through, pushchairs are being forced to go onto the road which is not safe, especially at busy times in the morning. Thank you for your support with this matter.

Remote Learning

Hopefully you have all had the opportunity to read the letter sent out about remote learning. If you have not then a copy of our remote learning plan can be found on our school website:

We are now uploading work onto Microsoft Teams each day for children to complete at home if they are isolating due to Covid-19. All children now have a login and password and these are stuck into their reading journals. We have also sent out a letter detailing children's login details for Teams and any other online subscriptions that we have purchased for them to use.

A 'Parent/ Carer Guide' has now been created to support you with helping your child to access Teams at home. This has been sent out to Parents/ Carers via the E-Schools app and is available on the school website:

Please remember that if the class 'bubble' has not been sent home then the teacher will still be teaching full time within school. It will therefore be very difficult for them to respond to queries regarding remote learning until after school. Should you require any immediate support then it will be best to contact the school office where Mr Heathcote, Mrs Pask and Mr Hearn can support you. A daily timetable will be uploaded to Teams to guide your child with their work. Please remember that the 'live' sessions WILL ONLY take place when the WHOLE CLASS BUBBLE has been sent home to isolate. These are not able to take place when the teacher is still teaching in the classroom.

If you do not have access to a suitable device (laptop or tablet), enough devices for your children or an internet connection then you will need to inform the school of this when your child is told to isolate. We will then try to support you with this.

It is an expectation that children fully access ALL remote learning whilst isolating at home.



E-Schools

Please can we ask all Parents/Carers to download the E-Schools app on their smartphone or device as soon as possible. Thank you to all those parents who have already done so. We are now using this platform to send out updates and useful information via email. Some of this will ONLY be sent out via the app so if you have not downloaded it then you may miss out on some important communications.

If you have any problems with the app or setting up your account then please email enquiries@isaacnewton-cit.co.uk. Mr Hearn will then be able to support you with this. If you have siblings in school then you will need to use the 'add account' section of the app for each child. Once set up you can then switch between children in the app.

Unfortunately, due to Covid-19, we will be unable to hold face-to-face Parents' Evenings this term. School Fruit

Free fruit is now available again to ALL children in school! The government provides children in Key Stage One with free fruit but as a school we feel that ALL children should be entitled to it, so have secured a charitable donation to help us provide this.



Please can you encourage your child to eat at least one piece of school fruit a day and take advantage of this fantastic initiative! As a school we are looking to try and stop all unhealthy snacks at break times and will therefore be offering children pieces of fruit as an alternative to any unhealthy snacks which we spot. We would appreciate it if you could support us by ensuring that your child does not come to school with unhealthy snacks such as chocolate biscuits, packets of crisps and sweets.
