


As always, the children have settled back into school wonderfully! I haven't been able to get around school as much as I would have

Cars at the Main Gate

Please DO NOT stop outside of the main gate in your car to collect or drop children off at school. There are yellow markings on the round to indicate that it is not permitted to



stop within this zone. Cars parked in this area are stopping permitted vehicles such as blue badge holders, staff and children's taxis from entering the school site. It is also becoming increasingly dangerous as cars are reversing out of this area when the gates are not opened and this has led to



some near misses with children. Mr Heathcote or Mrs Pask will continue to monitor this and we have now ordered some 'no stopping cones' which we will be put out each day to stop this issue from occurring. Please DO NOT stop or park your car outside of the main gate.

Behaviour On the School Site

Please can we ask all Parents/Carers to ensure that their children are behaving appropriately when on the school site. We work incredibly hard to promote and model excellent behaviour during the school day and



expect this to be continued during pick up and drop off times. This also includes siblings who attend other schools but are collecting children from Isaac Newton. Should such behaviour occur, e.g. swearing, riding bikes/scooters, disruptive behaviour, abusive or aggressive language then Parents/Carers will be contacted by Mr Heathcote and action will be taken. This could include the banning of such individuals from the school site. Thank you in advance for your support with this matter.

School Run Safety

LRSP Education Team update



Traffic around schools has become heavy again recently as schools have returned to normal. Many parents are opting to drive their children to school rather than walking or cycling.

All pupils and parents should be able to safely walk or cycle to and from school if they so choose to. The majority of people drive and park considerately and carefully around schools, however we would like to remind those who may have forgotten or are unsure of the rules.



School Keep Clear Zig Zags (Rule 238 of Highway Code)

The purpose of the markings is to keep school entrances clear to allow all pupils to arrive safely. Drivers should never stop on them, even to drop off or pick up passengers.

Yellow lines (Rule 238 of Highway Code)

Yellow lines are in place for the safety of all road and pavement users.

Remember double yellow lines mean no waiting or parking at any time, including when dropping off and picking up children.

Single yellow lines have the same restrictions within the times indicated on the nearby plate.

(Rule 243 taken from the Highway Code) DO NOT stop or park:

- near a school entrance
- anywhere you would prevent access for Emergency Services
- at or near a bus or tram stop or taxi rank
- on the approach to a level crossing/tramway crossing
- opposite or within 10 metres (32 feet) of a junction, except in an authorised parking space
- near the brow of a hill or hump bridge
- opposite a traffic island or (if this would cause an obstruction) another parked vehicle
- where you would force other traffic to enter a tram lane
- where the kerb has been lowered to help wheelchair users and powered mobility vehicles
- in front of an entrance to a property
- on a bend
- where you would obstruct cyclists' use of cycle facilities

(except when forced to do so by stationary traffic.)

School Crossing Patrols

They are employed by Lincolnshire County Council to safely cross children and parents.

Please ensure that you don't park too close to the patrols. This would block their view of the road, also preventing other drivers from seeing the patrol waiting to step out and stop the traffic.

We also ask that you follow instructions given by School Crossing Patrols to drivers and pedestrians.

School Crossing Patrols have the legal right to stop traffic; if they instruct you to stop you must stop. OBSERVE THE <u>HIGHWAY CODE</u>
PLEASE PARK AND DRIVE CONSIDERATELY
AROUND SCHOOLS.
